

All members of College are welcome in Chapel, which is open each day as a place for prayer and reflection. Chapel services are open to all. College Prayers is usually a service of Evensong, drawn from the Church of England's *Book of Common Prayer*. Morning and Evening Prayer are short services of Psalms, readings from Scripture and prayers, in modern English. The Eucharist (Mass, the Lord's Supper or Holy Communion) is offered throughout the week, as the sign of Christ's presence among us and as spiritual food for our daily lives. If you normally receive Communion, you are welcome to do so here. The Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) is available to members of College by arrangement with the Chaplain.

### **Special Events**

**Welcome back.** The first choral service of term, on the Sunday of first week (17<sup>th</sup> January), will be an **Epiphany Carol Service** by candlelight. Everyone is welcome at this festive event, which will mark the end of the Christmas season

The **new lighting in Chapel** will be inaugurated at Evensong on Sunday of 2<sup>nd</sup> week. Our guest preacher for this very special occasion will be Revd Graeme Richardson, Vicar of Harborne, Birmingham, and former Chaplain of the College. All are warmly invited to Chapel as we celebrate the completion of this work.

The **Platnauer Concert** takes place on Friday, 5<sup>th</sup> February at 6.00 p.m. Sospiri, a mixed-voice choir founded in 2006 by Christopher Watson and John Duggan, will showcase their large and diverse repertoire in a varied programme of choral works. The concert is free and open to all college members. Drinks will follow in the Medieval Kitchen for those who attend the concert.

The **University Church Intercollegiate Service** will take place on Sunday of 4<sup>th</sup> week at 6.00 p.m., at which our choir will sing together with the choirs of other Colleges. The speaker will be the novelist Adam Mars-Jones. There is no evening service in Chapel on this day.

**Lent** begins in week 4. On **Shrove Tuesday** (9<sup>th</sup> February) the Eucharist at 6.00 p.m. will be a simple celebration before Ale Verses. On **Ash Wednesday** (10<sup>th</sup>) there will be a simple Eucharist with Imposition of Ashes at 12.30 p.m. and a **Choral Eucharist with Imposition of Ashes at 6.00 p.m.** The Chaplain will be in Chapel on Shrove Tuesday from 5.00 p.m. for anyone who would like to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation (confession and absolution) before Lent begins; he is available at any other time by appointment.

**Roman Catholic Mass** takes the place of the College Eucharist on Tuesday of 7th week, and on Thursday of 8th week at 12.15 p.m.

**Theological Minds**, the chapel discussion group, will meet in Heb. 1 on Friday of weeks 2, 4 and 6 from 5.45 - 7.00 p.m. Drinks and nibbles will be provided. All are welcome.
