College Prayers is usually a service of Evensong, drawn from the Church of England's *Book of Common Prayer*. Morning and Evening Prayer are short services of Psalms, readings from Scripture and prayers, in modern English. The Eucharist (Mass, the Lord's Supper or Holy Communion) is offered throughout the week, as the sign of Christ's presence among us and as spiritual food for our daily lives. If you normally receive Communion, you are welcome to do so here. The Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) is available to members of College by arrangement with the Chaplain.
