Celebrating a Generous Gift



On Saturday 10 May, Brasenose alumni, graduate students, and Fellows gathered together to celebrate the opening of the newly-named Brademas Room, one of the rooms in the recently refurbished HCR in Old Quad, made possible thanks to a generous donation from alumnus and Honorary Fellow Professor John Brademas (BNC 1950).

The HCR moved from its previous quarters, in the old cloister next to the Deer Park, to Old Quad in 2006. The new rooms are bright, modern, and spacious, and are proving to be an excellent addition to Graduate life at BNC. In the future we hope that many more such projects can be undertaken, and that the quality of student life at BNC will go from strength to strength.

A celebratory dinner for alumni in Greece was also held on Monday 5 May, in recognition of Professor Brademas's Greek-American heritage, and his leadership in the BNC community. Economics Fellow Tony Courakis attended along with the Principal, Director of Alumni Relations and Development, and many of our Athens-based alumni.

The University has recently launched Oxford Thinking: The Campaign for the University of Oxford. Oxford competes with the other great universities of the world, especially those in North America, and we will face many challenges over the coming years as funding patterns change - and yet our missions to educate and to preserve and advance knowledge are as crucial as ever. It is with these challenges in mind that the University is launching its Campaign, and it will be no surprise that the central fundraising strategies will focus on support for academic posts, for facilities, and vitally for student bursaries and scholarships to ensure that access to Oxford is as wide as possible. These are themes dear to our heart at BNC and we join the other colleges in fully supporting the Campaign. We will be using our 500th anniversary to launch our own campaign - meaning that we have another year in which to lay solid foundations by consulting you, our students and alumni, with the aim of ensuring that we keep BNC among the leading colleges in Oxford and Oxford among the leading universities in the world. You can expect the pace to pick up further as we go into 2009.

Brasenose Annual Fund

We would like to thank everyone who has supported our first ever Annual Fund appeal. Your generosity has provided more than £230,000 (including Gift Aid) during this financial year, enabling BNC to:

- alleviate money worries for many students by launching several graduate scholarships providing funds for the duration of the recipients' courses, and by supporting any student who falls into financial hardship during their time here:
- \bigcup enhance student life by providing grants to the Boat Club for new furnishings and by subscribing to an online music library.

Money pledged for future years will provide a platform for our ongoing fundraising efforts. Our next appeal will be launched in September and our priorities will be to secure unrestricted funds for the area of immediate need, to increase provision for student support and student clubs, arts, and sports, and to raise funds for a programme of improvements to the library.

Oxford University and Brasenose will be participating in the Government's Matched Funding Scheme, which is to be launched in August and will provide matched funds for gifts received from new donors – so we hope that many more of you will want to help us make the most of this opportunity by making a donation to the Annual Fund.

Payroll Giving

Payroll Giving, or Give As You Earn, is a scheme that enables employees to give to any UK charity straight from their gross salary (before tax is deducted), and to receive immediate tax relief on donations. Christopher Harris (BNC 1984) describes his experience of Payroll Givine:

For alumni who work for companies who participate in Give As You Earn schemes, I think that this is a great way of giving to worthy causes like the College's Annual Fund. It's simple in that, once you have completed a mandate, a monthly donation is taken from your salary at source. But the real benefit is that it's tax-efficient, meaning that, as a higher rate taxpayer, you only pay 60% of the cost of the monthly donation from your net pay (or 80%, as a basic rate taxpayer). The College receives the full amount, and you as the donor are perhaps able to give more than you otherwise might if you donated via a regular standing order. In my case, my donation is also eligible for matched funding from my employer, so the scheme is doubly attractive.'

Payroll Giving provides charities like BNC with a regular, reliable income stream, allowing us to plan ahead. And it's easy to set up – just contact your payroll department and fill in a form. If your company doesn't already have a scheme, you can reassure them that it is simple and inexpensive to set up and run. A Word with Wendy Williams

on an annual exhibition during Oxford Artweeks, displaying their work in the splendid surroundings of Brasenose Antechapel. Wendy says that she feels lucky to have the opportunity to display her work in the antechapel. Asked what she enjoys most about painting, she says it is a relaxing hobby after a stressful day at work — although she affirms that working with the whole range of diverse people at BNC is fun and interesting, even if it does sometimes feel like 'lurching from one crisis to another!

A new Brasenose Etching



Some of the finest prints now being produced in the world are coming out of the studio of Master Printer Peter Kosowicz, at the Thumbprint Press in Camberwell, London. Jake and Dinos Chapman, Anthony Gormley, Tracey Emin, Anish Kapoor and Andrew Ingamells are among the artists who collaborate with Peter to realise their artistic ambitions. Current graduate students Stephen Bernard and Anna Johnson were lucky enough this term to be invited to the studios to see the realisation of one such ambition: the etching by Andrew Ingamells of Brasenose College, commissioned last year to celebrate our quincentenary in 2009. Here Stephen reports on their visit.

In the summer of 2007, I heard that a massively ambitious project had begun. Andrew Ingamells, the renowned London engraver, had decided to create a new 'Loggan', that is, a new collection of architectural etchings of all the colleges and halls of Oxford and Cambridge. This has not been done since the seventeenth century, and will stand as a twenty-first-century witness to the continuing autonomous character of the institutions which make up the oldest – and finest – universities in the country.

I immediately contacted Martin Village of Capital Prints – Ingamells's publisher – and set about persuading him that BNC should definitely be the next college Ingamells should etch. I had a forceful case: not only was the 500° anniversary of the College's foundation just two years away (and the College has a tradition of commissioning prints in such years), but the project itself would be a fantastic challenge – freed from the Lego-like uniformity of the medieval foundations and the blank neoclassical splendour of some of the larger colleges, Ingamells would be able to test his artistic skills to their limits. There's a lot you can say about Brasenose College, but you can't say that its architecture is not incredibly charismatic – and I have to say that in this the College did not let him down.

I arranged two things to persuade Martin and Ingamells of the powerful draw of the project: an incredibly rare visit to the leads of the Radcliffe Camera, from which hundreds and hundreds of digital photographs were taken, and a lunch in the Senior Common Room, where they could meet the inhabitants of this rather unusual shell. I am not sure which sealed the deal, but was delighted when Ingamells said he would set aside the best part of four months – the minimum amount of time it would take him to produce the initial drawing on which the etching would be based (on a good day, he says, it is possible to cover perhaps a square inch an hour – a level of achievement which I, as a D.Phil. student, can only admire) – and the project began.

As far as anyone knows, no other artist in the world is producing etchings of a quality even remotely comparable to Ingamells's. The etching techniques he uses to create his prints were innovative at the time the College was founded, others, such as using digital images for photographic reference, are cutting edge now—the combined effect of both is astounding. Whereas some of the more 'conceptual' artists who work along side him at the Thumbprint Press conceive but don't necessarily deliver, Ingamells is involved at every stage of the creation of an etching. Ingamells's work is of a different order to that of the other artists at the Press, requiring skills which take decades to perfect and months to execute; and you would have to travel a very long way, and probably end up in the studios of Lucian Freud or Frank Auerbach, before you found an artist prepared to work and rework in a medium to quite the extent that Ingamells does. The accuracy and detail of Ingamells's etchings is consequently phenomenal (illustrations of his work can be found at the Capital Prints website at: www.capitalprints.com).

As well as fine architectural depictions of the College by the finest artist in the field, the etching contains a description of its buildings and their history compiled by me, the strident figure who can be seen greeting the Principal at the start of their daily walk around the Meadows. That embodiment of the College – the College Secretary, Mrs Wendy Williams – and the shady perpendicular figure of the artist himself are among the other figures to be found embellishing the College in this splendid celebration of BNC in its quincentenary year.

College refurbishments



Easter vacation this year saw a flurry of activity as workmen moved in to begin much-needed renovations to the Hall. The eminent Brasenose people whose gazes accompany every dinner - from Alexander Nowell to Joyce Frankland, from Sir Richard Sutton to William Golding - were removed from their high positions and boxed away for a time, whilst the upper panels were cleaned, repaired, and re-varnished in a lighter shade. The ceiling has been repainted, and new lighting has been installed, meaning that meals are no longer lit by the harsh glare of fluorescent lighting, but by the much softer, more ambient effect of LED lighting.

Phase one of the project complete, the portraits were returned, the floors swept, and the furniture cleaned just in time for the Gaudy on 11 April. We have at present a two-tone Hall, with the lower wood panel retaining their dark look. The next phase of the project - due to be completed over the summer - will see the

lower panels undergo the same treatment as the upper have experienced, the restoration of the Hall tables and benches, and the installation of portrait lighting.

We look forward to sharing the end result with you, and hope that alumni taking up their dining rights will notice the improvement to the Hall environment. 
