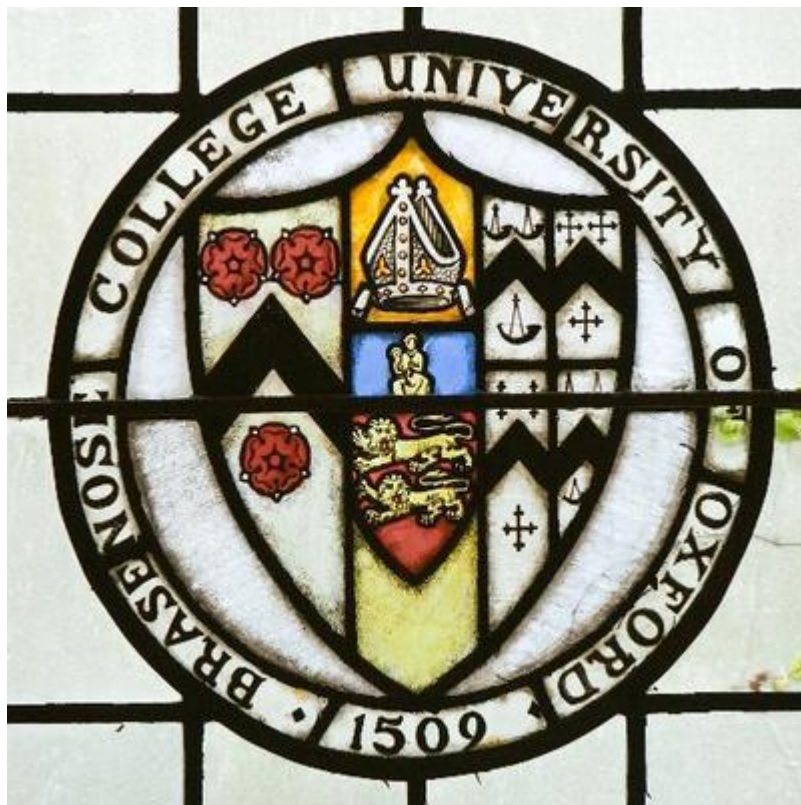

The President pronounces the Absolution

Please remain standing.

On Sundays or feast days we stand to say or sing the Gloria (see page 7)

*The President offers the Collect for the Day and all respond: **Amen***

This may be preceded by a brief period of silence, which is introduced by the words "Let us pray" or a longer bidding.

The Liturgy of the Word

We sit to listen to the first reading

This is the word of the Lord.

All Thanks be to God.

A hymn or Psalm may be said or sung

We stand for the Gospel

The Gospel may be heralded by an acclamation to which all respond ...

Alleluia (or in Lent Praise to you, O Christ, King of eternal glory)

The Lord be with you

All and also with you

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to *N.*

All Glory to you, O Lord.

at the end...

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

All Praise to you, O Christ.

There may be a homily

On Sundays or feast days we stand to say the Nicene or Apostles' Creed (see page 8)

Prayers of Intercession – we sit or kneel

One of these responses may be used. If an alternative is used it will be announced:

Lord in your mercy

or

Lord hear us

All Hear our prayer

All Lord, graciously hear us

...and at the end, either a Collect or this response

Merciful Father

All Accept these prayers

for the sake of your son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen

The Liturgy of the Sacrament

The Peace

The President introduces The Peace and says...

The peace of the Lord be always with you.

All **And also with you**

We are invited to share a sign of peace with each other

A hymn may be sung

Bread and wine are placed on the Altar and the President may offer prayers for the preparation of the gifts.

The Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord be with you

All **and also with you**

Lift up your hearts.

All **We lift them to the Lord.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All **It is right to give thanks and praise.**

The President praises God for his mighty acts and all respond with the Sanctus and Benedictus...

Holy, holy, holy Lord,

God of power and might,

heaven and earth are full of your glory.

Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

The President recalls the Last Supper and one of these acclamations may be used

All Great is the mystery of faith

The prayer continues leading into the doxology, all respond boldly...Amen

The Lord's Prayer – we sit or kneel

As our saviour taught us so we pray:
All **Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come,
your will be done,
on earth as in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins
as we forgive those who sin against us.
Lead us not into temptation
but deliver us from evil.
For the kingdom, the power, and the
glory are yours now and for ever.
Amen.**

Or Let us pray with confidence
as our saviour has taught us:
**Our Father, who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy name; thy
kingdom come; thy will be done;
on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass
against us.
And lead us not into temptation;
but deliver us from evil. For thine
is the kingdom, the power and
the glory, for ever and ever.
Amen.**

Breaking of the Bread

After Communion - The President offers a prayer then one of these prayers may be said by all:

feeding us with the body and blood
of your son Jesus Christ. Through him
we offer you our souls and bodies to
be a living sacrifice. Send us out in the
power of your Spirit to live and work
to your praise and glory.**

in the breaking of the bread.
Abide with us, we pray, that,
blessed by your royal presence,
we may walk with you all the
days of our life, and at its end
behold you in the glory of the
eternal Trinity, one God for
ever and ever. Amen.**

The Gloria – please stand

**Glory to God in the highest and peace to his people on earth.
Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father,
we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory.**

**Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God,
you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us;
you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer.**

**For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord,
you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit,
in the glory of God the Father.**

The Nicene Creed – please stand

We believe in one God the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come.

The Apostles' Creed – please stand

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

Amen.
